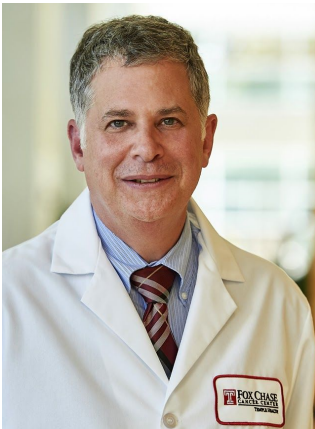
Title: What is the impact of Covid on clinical trials and lung cancer research?
